Published citations for gallantry award – Victoria Cross

Victoria Cross

One Victoria Cross was awarded to a member of the 102nd Battalion. Below is the published award citation as it appeared in the London Gazette.

Lt. Graham Thomson Lyall, 102nd Bn., 2nd Central Ontario R.

For most conspicuous bravery and skilful leading during the operations north of Cambrai.

On September 27th, 1918, whilst leading his platoon against Bourlon Wood, he rendered invaluable support to the leading company which was held up by a strong point, which he captured, by a flank movement, together with thirteen prisoners, one field gun and four machine guns.

Later, his platoon, now much weakened by casualties, was held up by machine guns at the southern end of Bourlon Wood. Collecting any men available, he led them towards the strong point, and springing

forward alone, rushed the position single-handed and killed the officer in charge, subsequently capturing at this point forty-five prisoners and five machine guns. Having made good his final objective, with a further capture of forty-seven prisoners, he consolidated his position and thus protected the remainder of the company.

On October 1st, in the neighbourhood of Blecourt, when in command of a weak company, by skilful dispositions he captured a strongly defended position, which yielded eighty prisoners and seventeen machine guns.

During two days of operations Lt. Lyall captured in all 3 officers, 182 other ranks, 26 machine guns and one field gun, exclusive of heavy casualties inflicted. He showed throughout the utmost valour and high powers of command.

Distinguished Service Order

A total of five Companions of the Distinguished Service Order were awarded to officers of the 102nd Battalion. Below are the known published award citations as they appeared in the London Gazette.

Maj. Alfred Blake Carey, Infy.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion in an attack, when he commanded the battalion with the greatest bravery and skill, secured all his objectives, and consolidated his position. Later, to clear up the situation, he made a valuable reconnaissance.

Capt. (A./Maj.) Fred Lister, M.C., Infy.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty in commanding his battalion for ten days in the trenches, during which they took part in five successful attacks on the enemy's lines, and resisted three vigorous counter-attacks. The success of the whole of this operation was due to his tireless supervision and the personal example which he set his men in preparing for the attacks, and consolidating the ground when it had been captured. He contributed largely to the capture of ground of the greatest tactical value, which had previously been unsuccessfully attacked.

A total of thirty-nine Military Crosses and six Bars for second awards were awarded to officers of the 102nd Battalion CEF. Below are the known details and text of the published award citations as they appeared in the London Gazette for the Military Cross and the Bar to the Military Cross.

Lt. Isaac Cubit Raymond Atkin, Infy.

Bar to the Military Cross

Capt. Isaac Cubit Raymond Atkin, M.C., 102nd Bn., Can. Inf., 2nd Central Ontario R.

“For conspicuous gallantry and good leadership. This officer in command of a company had to clear a wood very strongly held by machine-gun posts. Moving by section rushes, he got within 50 yards of the wood, and then himself led a charge, capturing many prisoners, four trench mortars and seven machine guns. The capture of the wood was the key of the attack, and it was due to his fine effort that the operation was successful. (M.C. gazetted 27th October, 1917.)”

Lieut (A./Capt.) Vyvyan Chard Brimacombe, 102nd Can. Bn., 2nd Cent. Ont. R.

“For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. After reaching the first objective, this officer followed in support of companies which had passed through him until a strongly defended wood was reached. Here a gap was forced by the defence between the leading companies. This he promptly closed with his platoons, and, outflanking a machine-gun nest, enabled the right company to rush the wood. He showed initiative and total disregard of danger.”

Lt. Richard John Burde, Inf.

For conspicuous gallantry in action. He maintained supplies throughout the action and cleared the battlefield, working continuously day and night and displaying great courage and determination.

When badly wounded he refused to leave the field until the objective had been reached, or to have his wounds dressed until all the wounded near had received attention.”

“During a raid he was the first to lead his men into the enemy trench, and he successfully accomplished the object of the enterprise, capturing prisoners and inflicting heavy casualties. He conducted the difficult withdrawal with great skill, evacuating all casualties and leaving no identification behind. Throughout the operation he displayed admirable courage and coolness.”

“For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. This officer carried out a very successful raid with his company, causing over fifty casualties to the enemy and capturing ten prisoners. He superintended the whole arrangements and accompanied the supporting platoon, remaining until every member of the party had returned. That the raid accomplished its object without serious casualties to our men was largely due to his handling and attention to detail.”

Lt. Hedley John Goodyear, 102nd Can. Bn., 2nd. Cent. Ont. R.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. Totally regardless of danger, this officer led his platoon forward to the capture of a wood, which was stubbornly defended by machine-gun posts. When the other platoon commanders had become casualties, he reorganised their platoons and took charge of the skirmishing line, which he finally led in a charge, ensuring the success of the day's operation. He set a fine example of coolness and determination.

Lt. Charles Stuart Griffin, Infy.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty in personally leading his platoon against concrete machine gun emplacements and enemy trenches in spite of heavy rifle and machine gun fire. He was completely successful in obtaining all his objectives, capturing sixteen prisoners and two machine guns. During the day he repulsed three counter-attacks. He displayed the greatest coolness and gallantry during the action and afterwards, and the success was due to his personal efforts.

It was entirely owing to his leadership and dash that his objective was obtained, as his men had to climb over a steep embankment before they could commence the attack.

**Lt. (A./Capt.) John Grant Knight, M.C., 102nd Bn., Can. Infy., 2nd Cent. Ont. R.
(M.C. gazetted 17th September, 1917.)**

For conspicuous courage and able leadership during the advance from Dury to the Canal du Nord 3rd-4th September. He led his company through heavy shell and machine-gun fire with very small casualties, and successfully reached his objectives. When information was required regarding the bridges over the Canal du Nord he went out with two scouts over open country commanded by enemy machine-gunners and snipers, and personally obtained valuable information.

Lt. Stephen Forester Knight, Inf.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. When all other officers had become casualties he took charge and displayed great courage and skill in dealing with a very difficult situation.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. After the first objective had been gained his company passed through, but was held up by a system of trenches in the open. Handling the situation with coolness and daring, he succeeded in turning the left flank of the opposition. He was the first man over the top when the strong point was captured, and it was due to his leadership that the company got through with a minimum of casualties.

Lt. James Alexander Mann, 102nd Bn., Can. Infy., 2nd Cent. Ont. R.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty during operations west of the Canal du Nord from 2nd to 5th September, 1918, especially on 3rd September, when his company was ordered to effect a hurried relief and to send out patrols to get in touch with the enemy. In the absence of his company commander he carried out this order most ably, and patrolled the whole battalion frontage and advanced a mile, displaying such good leadership that his men passed through heavy fire with a minimum of casualties.

Lt. Robert Pope Matheson, Can. Inf.

For conspicuous gallantry in action. He led his company in the attack with great courage and determination. Later, although wounded, he continued to remain at duty and to encourage his men.

Lt. James Moncur Ogilvie, 102nd Bn., Can. Infy., 2nd C. Ont. E.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty south and east of Valenciennes, from 3rd to 6th November, 1918. He went out with one man to establish the exact location of the unit on the brigade right flank, which, at great personal risk, he succeeded in doing, thus rendering invaluable assistance in effecting the necessary connection. Later, he showed magnificent qualities of courage and leadership as platoon commander in action, when over forty prisoners and a large number of machine guns were captured, and very heavy casualties in killed and wounded inflicted on the enemy.

Capt. Thomas Patrick O'Kelly, M.C., Infy.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty as brigade transport officer during lengthy operations. He went forward every night under constant shell fire to ensure supplies getting through, and only his courage and resource enabled this to be successfully done, as casualties to men and animals were very heavy. His courage and determination "were the more conspicuous as, throughout the whole period, he was suffering from a broken shoulder, and, in spite of severe pain, refused to withdraw until the division was relieved.

As soon as the barrage lifted he dashed forward with his men, personally inflicting several casualties, and heading off a party of ten, who were subsequently taken prisoner. On the recall signal he directed the retirement of his men with wounded and prisoners, being the last to leave.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty in command of a company on 3rd and 4th September, 1918, during the advance from Bury to the Canal du Nord. He disposed his men with such skill, under heavy fire, that his company came through with a minimum of casualties, and he was enabled to establish an outpost line some 400 yards west of the canal. At dusk he accompanied a reconnoitring patrol, which came into contact with the enemy outside Lock Wood, and returned with valuable information. He showed great initiative, and set a fine example to his men.

Distinguished Conduct Medal

A total of nineteen Distinguished Conduct Medals were awarded to members of the 102nd Battalion. Below are the eight known published award citations as they appeared in the London Gazette.

703661 Sjt. (A./C.S M.) H. Alway, 102nd Bn., Can. Infy.

For conspicuous gallantry during the attack near Beaucourt-en-Santerre, 8th August, 1918. After his platoon commander had become a casualty he took command, steadied the men, and led them in a charge against a strongly held position on the edge of Seaucourt Wood. On reaching the wood he rushed round the flank of an enemy section, and, by cutting off the retreat, forced twenty of the garrison to surrender. This he did single-handed. He set a fine example of fearlessness to his men.

703567 Sjt. C. V. Brewer, M.M., Infy.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion, to duty. During an important raid on the enemy's trenches, when his officer had been wounded, Sjt. Brewer took command of the platoon. Creeping forward, under heavy rifle and machine-gun fire, he cut a gap in some fresh wire put down by the enemy, through which he led his men, being the first man into the enemy's trench. Though wounded in five, different places, he fought with bomb and bayonet in most gallant fashion, inflicting heavy casualties on the enemy until, on the signal for recall, he collected his men and brought them back in good order with their casualties. In spite of his own injuries he carried out one wounded man himself, and after bestowing him in the hands of the stretcher bearers he went back and helped to carry out his officer. His behaviour throughout was an example of fine courage and devotion to duty.

For conspicuous gallantry during the attack near Beaucourt-en-Santerre. His company was held up by a strongly held trench system in the open beyond Beaucourt Wood. At a critical moment a platoon commander became a casualty. This warrant officer at once dashed forward, under terrific fire, and took the officer's place, rallied the men, and, inspiring them by his example, captured the trench, killing many of the enemy and taking prisoners, three of whom he captured single-handed. His prompt action undoubtedly saved an awkward situation, and contributed largely to the success of our operation.
